Ten Signs of a Struggling Club And Questions to Ask

1. Club membership falls below 20 for more than one dues cycle

- When was your last Open House?
- When was your last membership drive?

2. Club membership continues to decline after two dues cycles

- How many members have left due to life/work circumstances?
- Do you know why your members are not renewing?

3. Club officers are not attending training

- Do your veteran officers feel they have nothing new to learn?
- Can those veteran officers train others in that role?

4. Club fails to submit dues on time

- Is this a corporate club where the company pays the dues?
- Is the accounting department aware of the correct due dates?
- Are due dates being communicated to members in a timely manner

5. Club fails to submit club officer lists on time or does not submit list at all

- Are members aware of the deadline for submitting officer lists?
- Are members aware of the requirement for submitting officer lists?

6. Club members do not participate in any activities outside the club

- Do members consider TM a strictly work-related activity?
- Are members aware of opportunities outside the club environment?

7. Club members fail to submit educational achievements

- Do the club officers encourage Pathways related speeches?
- Do the club officers give Pathways related speeches?
- Do club officers know how to submit completed projects to TI?

8. Club is not conducting quality meetings

- Has the club conducted the Moments of Truth module in the past 6 months?
- Is there an agenda at every meeting?
- Are members encouraged to sign up for all roles in advance?

9. Club members are too busy to attend meetings and start canceling meetings

- Corporate: is the company fully supportive of the club?
- Community: has the club reconsidered time/location/day to better serve the members?

10. Club champion(s) burn out / quit because they have failed to prepare successors and motivate others to take on leadership roles
